

## 3 Year Old Developmental Checklist

Yes Sometimes Not Yet

Knows their last name, gender, name of street living on, and parts	5	
of several nursery rhymes		
Stays with one non-computer activity for eight or nine minutes		
Sings songs		
Enjoys speaking without avoidance or embarrassment		
Takes turns in conversations		
Demonstrates the attention to remain talking about a single topic of conversation for 2-3 minutes		
Understands concepts of "one, many, big, little, same, different, empty, full, clean, dirty, etc."		
Understands concepts of time such as "night" and "day"		
Uses words to tell you about relationships, interesting objects and creative ideas		
Produces speech which is understood by strangers and parents over 80% of the time		
Produces most consonant sound correctly		
Includes final consonants on words (e.g., blanke <u>t</u> , mi <u>n</u> e, dog)		
Rarely stutters and only occasionally repeats or hesitates as in "ma-ma-mamom"
