

30-Month Old Developmental Checklist

Developmental Checklist	Yes	Sometimes	Not Yet
Matches colors and shapes			
Matches objects to pictures			
Says "1, 2, 3" as he/she counts objects			
Plays cooperatively next to another child using similar objects			
Talks to self			
Uses verbal language as his/her primary means of expression			
Uses speech to be social			
Asks/answers at least three questions to carry on a conversation with another person			
Talks about immediate experiences (e.g., "Billy push car")			
Identifies a minimum of two body parts from picture, self or doll			
Points to most common pictures in a picture book			
Identifies objects by use (e.g., "Which one do we drink out of? Sleep in? Sit on?")			
Understands the concepts of "one" and "one more"			
Names pictures that show actions (e.g., running, eating)			
Has an expressive vocabulary of 200-300 words			
Refers to self by name (e.g., "Mark eat")			
Uses "m, n, p, ng, w" correctly in speech
